Howard Clarke is recognised as a leading Intelligence Analyst having worked in Australia, Europe and North America with the former National Crime Authority, Australian Federal Police (Aust); National Criminal Intelligence Service, HM Customs & Excise (UK); Europol, Politie Haaglanden (Netherlands); Coordinated Law Enforcement Unit, Royal Canadian Mounted Police (Canada).

He has conducted Strategic Threat and Risk Assessment assignments for the RCMP in support of National and Regional Port Security and Border Integrity programs and has presented Threat and Risk issues impacting Canada's port and marine sectors. His research of threat identification focuses on marine security trends and developments within international and Canadian marine cargo and shipping sectors.

Howard is visiting Australia in April/May and will share the knowledge he has gained overseas in these series of 3 events:

Port and Border Security – Strategic Threat and Risk Assessment. This 5 day course will provide registrants with current international methodology for the conduct of Strategic Threat and Risk assessments in Border Protection and Integrity and Port Security. The content will be delivered through a combination of lecture, discussion and hands-on practical exercises.

Developing an Intelligence Capacity to Safeguard Major Marine Ports. This 2 day workshop focuses on the challenges of safeguarding Australia's Ports and associated Marine systems. The knowledge gained will enable registrants to develop effective and enhance supportive Intelligence capabilities.

Learning from Intelligence Failures. This 1 day seminar analyses recent notorious Intelligence failures. The insights gained by the examination of the recurrent themes and their implications for intelligence and risk practitioners can be used to mitigate future national security threats. This may be achieved through the improved development and timely utilization of quality intelligence. It will also enhance the effectiveness of law enforcement by anticipating emerging threats.
